

CENTER CELEBRATES OPENING FOR NEW SEVIER CO. OUTPATIENT CENTER



Helen Ross McNabb Center celebrated the ribbon cutting for its newest facility serving Sevier County and surrounding areas on August 21.

“This new building will allow us to expand our services in the region,” said Shellie Hall, senior director of Sevier County services. “We are thrilled by the community’s support and look forward to using this opportunity to improve more lives.”

Helen Ross McNabb Center has a long history serving individuals in Sevier County. The Center began serving children through the Smoky Mountain Children’s Home in November 2006 and opened its first outpatient facility there in April 2010. Due to space limitations, the Center expanded again in 2014 and this newest facility is the result of continued growth in the region.

The new 8,000 square foot facility will allow the Center to sup-

port additional staff hired to meet the community’s needs. The Sevier County Center offers outpatient mental health services for adults and children as well as intensive outpatient services.



In addition, specialty programs are offered in Sevier County, including System of Care Across Tennessee (SOCAT) and Tennessee Health Link. Recently, all three managed care organizations recognized Helen Ross McNabb Center’s performance under the Tennessee Health Link Care Coordination program. Tennessee Health Link is a model for integrated care by providing coordination for TennCare members with the highest behavioral health needs.

The new facility was made possible by Helen Ross McNabb Foundation’s fundraising efforts, including contributions by Pigeon Forge, City of Gatlinburg, Sevier County, the State of Tennessee and various private donors like First Horizon’s President, David Miller.

“First Tennessee and First Horizon have a long tradition of supporting our communities, dating back to 1864” said David Miller, president of the East Tennessee region for First Horizon Bank. “We are honored to support this incredible new Helen Ross McNabb location, bringing much-needed mental health expertise to our fellow citizens in Sevier County.”

COMMUNITY DAY



Helen Ross McNabb Center and The Behavioral Health Awareness Coalition (BHAC) held their annual Community Day awareness event in Market Square in Knoxville on Friday, October 4.

Community Day, a traditional part of Mental Illness Awareness Week, aims to raise awareness, reduce stigma and provide information regarding mental health resources in our community. Attendees were able to gather information from more than 20 organizations about the services available in the Knoxville area.

Organizations ranged from behavioral health resources to insurance services to physical health booths. In addition, there were numerous activities, including food, face painting and door prizes for attendees. The Kincaid Band and WIVK 107.7 FM provided entertainment and emcee services for the event.

FLOWERS ON THE WATER

Helen Ross McNabb Center partnered with Junior League of Knoxville for its inaugural Domestic Violence Awareness Month event.

Flowers on the Water was held Tuesday, October 8 at The Pavilion at Hunter Valley Farm. It featured a brief program where Knox County District Attorney General Charme Allen spoke as she works with domestic violence all too frequently.

“Decreasing the number of victims begins with events like this,” said Allen. “Domestic violence is something that shouldn’t happen.”

Following the program, attendees

released flower petals onto the water to recognize individuals who have been impacted by domestic violence.

Organizations like YMCA, Sexual Assault Center of Tennessee (SACET) and the Community Coalition Against Human Trafficking (CCAHT) were in attendance to provide information on local resources for individuals who are experiencing or have experienced domestic violence.

During the event, Helen Ross McNabb Center accepted donations of new full-size hygiene items; new or “like new” shoes; and new women’s underwear to benefit clients served by the Center’s victim services programming.

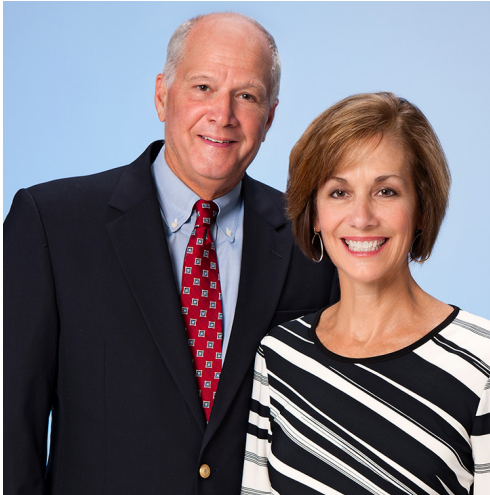
