

FOUNDATION COMPLETES \$2.35 MILLION CAMPAIGN TO EXPAND CENTERPOINTE TREATMENT FACILITY



The Helen Ross McNabb Foundation is excited to announce the completion of its \$2.35 million capital campaign, which will bring additional much-needed substance use treatment beds to the Greater Knoxville region.

“This is an important initiative for our community,” said Ted Flickinger and Richard Maples, campaign co-chairs. “By increasing capacity and providing greater access to affordable care, we can save lives in the community.”

The demand for access to affordable, medically monitored detox and residential substance use treatment continues to grow in Knoxville. In 2020, Knox County saw more than 370 suspected drug overdose deaths, which was a nearly 30 percent increase from the prior year.

The Foundation’s capital campaign will expand and refresh the McNabb Center’s CenterPointe facility, which offers residential substance use and detox treatment services. In FY 2020, CenterPointe served nearly 1,500 individuals; however, there is a consistent wait list for treatment and the need far surpasses the Center’s current capacity.

The Helen Ross McNabb Foundation eclipsed its \$2.35 million goal, raising more than \$2.4 million.

“We are thankful for the McNabb Center and its commitment to serving individuals who suffer from addiction. The Helen Ross McNabb Foundation’s CenterPointe project provides additional access to address this critical challenge in our community. Together, we can provide a path to recovery and a happier and more productive life.” – The Boyd Foundation

The project is supported by contributions from The University of Tennessee Medical Center, The Boyd Foundation, Knox County, the City of Knoxville and numerous community donors.

CENTER RESPONDS TO TRAUMATIC EVENT

The McNabb Center often assists when traumatic events occur within our communities. On April 12, 2021, an officer-involved shooting took place at Knoxville's Austin-East Magnet High School, resulting in the death of a student.

Students, educators and administrators all needed help processing the incident. The McNabb Center partnered with the school district and provided nearly a dozen counselors to support the school community and to assist with the debriefing process.

The Center's mental health professionals conducted group counseling sessions for students and teachers over multiple days.



“The McNabb Center already provides a mental health counselor at every middle and high school in Knox County,” said Mary Katsikas, senior director of children & youth mental health programming. “Following this tragic situation, we have assigned additional staff to the school to further address any needs and to support the community as they heal.”

Youth who are faced with traumatic situations, such as gun violence, often need guidance processing their emotions. The McNabb Center is here to help any parent or student in need of support.

CRISIS STABILIZATION UNIT TO OPEN IN HAMBLLEN COUNTY

A new Crisis Stabilization Unit (CSU) will soon open at the McNabb Center's Hamblen County campus. The CSU provides intensive, short-term stabilization for individuals experiencing a mental health emergency.

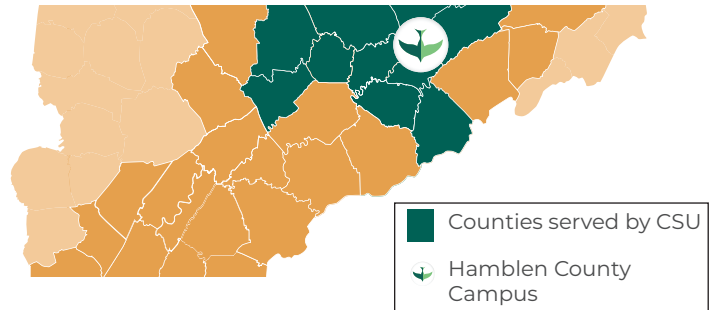
The 15-bed unit will offer care 24 hours a day, seven days a week for those who are 18 or older and facing a behavioral health crisis. The CSU will serve the Tennessee Department of Mental Health & Substance Abuse Services (TDMHSAS) Regions 1 and 2, which include Anderson, Campbell, Claiborne, Cocke, Grainger, Hamblen, Hancock, Hawkins, Jefferson and Union counties.

“The goal of this unit is to divert people, when appropriate, from psychiatric hospitalization,” said Sharon Reid, McNabb Center's senior director of Hamblen County services. “We believe individuals are best served within their natural support system in their own communities, and the CSU supports this philosophy.”

The CSU will be located in an existing building at the Center's Hamblen County campus. Renovations have begun and the Center expects the CSU to be operational this Fall.

This project is funded through the Tennessee Department of Mental Health & Substance Abuse Services (TDMHSAS).

“We know that mental health care works best when people have multiple options at multiple levels, and this Crisis Stabilization Unit in Hamblen County will do just that. It will provide options for people living through a mental health crisis, their families, staff in emergency departments and law enforcement officers,” said Marie Williams, TDMHSAS Commissioner. “We are excited to see the opening of this Crisis Stabilization Unit, and we are grateful to our partners at the McNabb Center for their tireless work to serve the mental health needs of this community.”



CENTER ADVOCACY ACHIEVES LEGISLATIVE WIN

The McNabb Center recently advocated for the permanent continuation of the Telehealth Bill, which allows behavioral health services to originate from a client's home. This legislation passed unanimously in the State House of Representatives and Senate and was signed into law by Governor Bill Lee. This bill, which numerous behavioral health organizations advocated for during the legislative session, expands access to care for clients in need.

The bill was sponsored by Iris Rudder and co-sponsored by Mike Sparks, Esther Helton, Mark White and Dan Howell. This is significant because it prioritizes client choice in how they access needed mental health services.

In addition to the telehealth legislation, the Center successfully advocated for additional funding for the Military Services program. This \$150,000 direct appropriation was included in the Governor's final, amended budget and approved by the legislature.

The McNabb Center's Military Services program is available to anyone who has served in the military, their family members or their caregivers. The Center believes it is important to serve

those who have courageously served, or continue to actively serve, our country. The specially-trained military services therapists can assist individuals facing post-traumatic stress disorder, depression, anxiety, substance use, co-occurring disorders, thoughts of suicide and other invisible wounds incurred from service.

Jerry Vagnier, McNabb Center CEO; Houston Smelcer, vice president of development and government relations; and Lindsay Hughes, legislative advocacy coordinator recently spent a day at the State Capitol and visited face-to-face with 22 legislators.

Their time in Nashville was spent advocating on two issues that are important for our clients and staff: 1) a permanent continuation of the Telehealth Bill, to allow services to originate from a client's home; and 2) better wages for clinical staff through a state-wide \$2.9 million appropriations budget amendment.

Staff campaign raises nearly \$100,000!

Each year, the Helen Ross McNabb Foundation reaches out to Center employees to support services that help fill the gaps in our community. For more than 10 years staff have shown their support through the Annual Staff Campaign, and each year they go above and beyond to ensure the success of these programs. This year, the Foundation provided three opportunities for donations:

CenterPointe Campaign

CenterPointe is the only treatment facility of its kind in East Tennessee to offer lifesaving service to uninsured individuals with no means to access treatment. In FY20, the Center served nearly 1,500 individuals throughout its residential addiction and detox treatment services.

Hamilton County Therapeutic Preschool Playground

The Chattanooga Therapeutic Preschool opened in August 2020, providing 10 weeks of intensive early intervention services to children ages 4-6 who have been abused, neglected or experienced trauma of any kind.

The Center believes it is important to promote the full preschool experiences as well as opportunities for laughter and healthy play within treatment. In order to provide a safe outdoor space, the McNabb Center has partnered locally with Playcore to designed a playground for clients enrolled in the program.

Hamblen County Jail to Work

The Jail to Work program began in 2017 to help promote the recovery of women who have a substance use disorder and are involved in the criminal justice system. To date, 88% of the women have successfully completed the program and maintained employment. Additional funding is needed to support Jail to Work services in Hamblen County.

Because staff are committed to the Center's mission of improving the lives of the people we serve, they raised more than \$98,000 to support these two initiatives.
