On April 28, the McNabb Center welcomed Governor Bill Lee to the McMinn County clinic. During his visit, the Center's leadership shared with Gov. Lee the great work of the McMinn County staff and discussed the unique needs of Tennessee's rural counties. Jerry Vagnier, McNabb Center CEO, and Mona Blanton-Kitts, McNabb Center president also thanked the governor for the state's investments in mental health care and substance use treatment.

MCNABB CENTER, CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL CUT RIBBON ON ADOLESCENT CRISIS STABILIZATION UNIT

The McNabb Center and East Tennessee Children's Hospital cut the ribbon on the Children's Crisis Stabilization Unit on May 19. Lieutenant Governor Randy McNally, Knox County Mayor Glenn Jacobs and Deputy Commissioner Matt Yancey of the Tennessee Department of Mental Health & Substance Abuse Services, along with numerous local leaders, officials and community representatives joined the celebration.

The first of its kind in Tennessee, this pediatric CSU will serve children in need of behavioral health treatments, including therapy, medication and other services to help them work through a mental health crisis.

“This unique service will provide a safe place to address the needs of children and families experiencing a mental health crisis,” said Jerry Vagnier, McNabb Center CEO. “The CSU will allow these families better access to specialized care when faced with a mental health crisis and can help divert a child from psychiatric hospitalization when appropriate.”

VAGNIER ANNOUNCES RETIREMENT, BLANTON-KITTS NEXT CEO



After 35 years of improving lives with the McNabb Center, Jerry Vagnier announced his retirement as the Center's Chief Executive Officer effective August 31, 2022.

“I have enjoyed an unimaginable career and watched the Center grow, expand and achieve its mission. Throughout my time with the McNabb Center, I have developed

many cherished partnerships and friendships with people and organizations doing great work in the behavioral health field across the state,” he said.

Mona Blanton-Kitts has been appointed as CEO, effective September 1, 2022. Mona began her career with the McNabb Center in 1986 and has seen success at every level. The Center looks forward to growth under her leadership.

EXPANDED FUNDING IMPROVES SALARIES, ACCESS TO CARE

In order to achieve the best care for individuals in need, the clinical workforce must be paid a living wage. By advocating for improved reimbursement rates, McNabb Center's leaders are advocating for better pay for clinical staff.

“Social workers should not have to take a vow of poverty,” said Jerry Vagnier, McNabb Center CEO.

This year, by advocating for McNabb Center staff and social workers across the state, leadership yielded strong results. The budget, which was approved by the General Assembly, includes an additional \$30 million between the Tennessee Department of Mental Health

and Substance Abuse Services (TDMHSAS) and the Department of TennCare for improved reimbursement rates.

The McNabb Center has also advocated for better access to mental health care services for individuals with an urgent need.

Governor Bill Lee included \$4.25 million in funding for a three-year pilot project as an alternative for emergency department services. The project, which received legislative approval, is supported by Knoxville Mayor Indya Kincannon and Knox County Mayor Glenn Jacobs and will establish a dual acute and behavioral healthcare center on the former St. Mary's Hospital campus.

TDMHSAS & TENNCARE BUDGET DETAILS

Under TDMHSAS Commissioner Marie Williams's leadership, the TDMHSAS budget includes \$18 million in provider rate improvements for organizations with mental health contracts with the Department.

With the support of TennCare Commissioner Steven Smith, the TennCare budget includes more than \$12 million in improvements, which include:

- \$7 million toward Community Mental Health Center outpatient rate increases
- \$1.1 million for mental health crisis provider rate increases
- \$2 million to increase rates for Comprehensive Child and Family Treatment Home Base Treatment
- \$2 million for Children and Youth and Substance Use Disorder Residential Treatment rate increases

CLAIBORNE COUNTY JAIL TO WORK

The McNabb Center has expanded its Jail to Work program and celebrated the ribbon cutting of its newest location in Claiborne County.

“We are thrilled by the community’s support around the Jail to Work program,” said McNabb Center President Mona Blanton-Kitts. “We believe, with treatment and supportive services, the women served by this program can become productive citizens of Claiborne County and lead healthy, successful lives.”

Through this program, the Center provides rehabilitation services, including therapy, substance use treatment and life skills to incarcerated women who are housed in the new facility. In addition to finding gainful employment, the women will pay restitution. After eight to 12 weeks, the women in the program graduate and move back into the community.

The Claiborne County service is the second Jail to Work program implemented by the McNabb Center. In 2017, the Center established Jail to Work in Hamblen County. The success of that program has been unprecedented and the McNabb Center is eager to replicate that success in Claiborne County.

MCNABB CENTER EXPANDS SERVICES WITHIN HAMBLLEN COUNTY

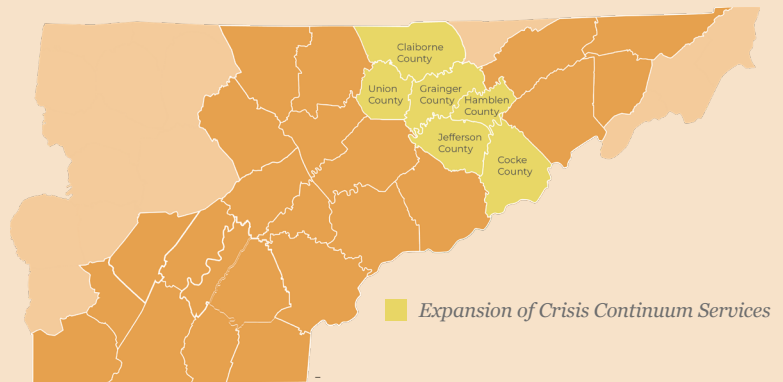


This year, following the closure of Harbor of Hamblen, the McNabb Center began delivering domestic violence advocacy services in Hamblen County.

“Harbor of Hamblen stepped in the gap when CEASE abruptly closed 18 months ago to ensure domestic violence advocacy services were available to the community,” said Jerry Vagnier, McNabb Center CEO. “The McNabb Center has been providing domestic violence services including prevention, advocacy, shelter and transitional housing for decades and is ready to pick up where Harbor of Hamblen has advanced services.”

The McNabb Center is excited to continue the expansion of services within Hamblen County by adding a Mobile Crisis Unit and extend its Domestic Violence services.

The Center will begin offering mobile crisis services to Hamblen, Claiborne, Cocke, Grainger, Jefferson and Union Counties on July 1st. This expansion adds to the region’s crisis continuum as the Center opened the Crisis Stabilization Unit last October. The Center has a robust crisis continuum in Knoxville, serving both adults and children in need.

The McNabb Center was awarded a \$5 million grant by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Agency (SAMHSA) to create a crisis continuum of care for children, including the Children’s CSU at East Tennessee Children’s Hospital. The CSU is one piece of a comprehensive continuum of care to address the increasing mental health crisis needs in children and teens in East Tennessee.

Through a partnership between the McNabb Center and Children’s Hospital, clinicians will determine how long a child can stay in the CSU based upon their needs. Once a child is stabilized, they may receive intensive community-based treatment through the McNabb Center.

“Children’s Hospital is proud to partner with the McNabb Center on this first in the state resource,” said Matt Schaefer, East Tennessee Children’s Hospital President & CEO. “The children in this region and across the nation are struggling like never before with their mental health and we must be there in their moment of greatest need. This CSU has been designed and built for just that moment.”

Families will be able to access CSU services through the emergency department or through a Mobile Crisis Unit. The Children’s CSU is one of many crisis services in the McNabb Center’s continuum. It runs an adult-focused crisis stabilization unit in both Knoxville and Morristown and operates Mobile Crisis Units for children and adults.

Staff campaign raises \$115,000!

Each year, the Helen Ross McNabb Foundation reaches out to Center employees to support services that help fill gaps in our community. For more than 10 years staff have shown their support through the Annual Staff Campaign, and each year they go above and beyond to ensure the success of these programs. This year, the Foundation provided three opportunities for donations:

Domestic Violence Transitional Housing

Since 2007, the Center's Transitional Housing Assistance Program has offered resources and services for domestic violence survivors' long-term housing and safety needs. This project will create six two-bedroom apartment units, six one-bedroom apartment units and on-site offices for McNabb Center staff and group meeting space when complete.

Hamilton County and McMinn County Campaign

The Hamilton County and McMinn County outpatient locations provide mental health and substance use treatment, therapy and case management services to adults and children living in Hamilton, McMinn and surrounding communities. This project will provide benches and outdoor seating at our Hamilton and McMinn locations to ensure our clients receive quality and compassionate care in an inviting environment.

Hamblen County Jail to Work

The Jail to Work program began in 2017 to help promote the recovery of women who have a substance use disorder and are involved in the criminal justice system. To date, 88 percent of the women have successfully completed the program and maintained employment. Additional funding is needed to support Jail to Work services in Hamblen County.

Because staff are committed to the Center's mission of improving the lives of the people we serve, they raised more than **\$115,000** to support these initiatives.
